The Winter Warmer is a café style `drop in` and takes place in the Parish Centre each Saturday morning from 10am until 12 noon. Each week so far we have welcomed 50 to 60 people of ages from 2 to 92 who enjoy a choice of hot drink and food free of charge, friendly conversations and a relaxed morning amongst friends.

We have found that members of the parish and wider community have found it a valuable way to get to know others and also to bring friends and neighbours. It has been wonderful to hear what it has meant for some people to be able to mix socially and for families with young children to have a safe and welcoming place to relax together.

Our team of volunteers is also enjoying being part of the occasion – chatting with guests, discussing food and drink choices (from the menu on the table!) and making everyone welcome.

Please do come and join us on a Saturday morning – you and anyone with you will be made very welcome.

We originally planned a 12 week pilot project, finishing on the 30th March, Easter Saturday. We have already had 6 weeks and so will be engaging with the guests and volunteers over the next few weeks to help us decide what to do next. We don't want to lose the momentum we have, nor the good will of the community we are serving, but also need to be mindful of the volunteering capacity within the Parish. We trust that God will steer us on the right course.



`Bethel programme' on-line survey

At the end of last year, the Bethel team asked Parish members for their ideas and opinions on ways that we could help to meet community needs, how our premises could be adapted to help with this and to offer any relevant skills and knowledge in support of our outreach.

We want to thank all those who completed the online survey form (over 40 responses). It was clear that members had given very careful consideration to their responses and several have offered their skills in support of the work. Several consistent themes emerged regarding both our local community and our church and parish centre buildings. The main themes were:

Community:

- A greater focus on teenagers and young families including housing, mental health, bereavement and financial challenges.
- Supporting our members who carry out voluntary roles in the wider community (prayer, training).

Premises:

- Accessibility and inclusion, including w.c.'s and a small servery in the church building.
- Improving the acoustics in the Parish Centre.
- Environmental sustainability is a crucial factor as we plan improvements to the premises.

The detailed responses will be presented to the PCC and are already being used by the Bethel team in planning and prioritising for the future.



World Day of Prayer 1st March 2024

World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice.



This year's service has been written by an ecumenical group of Palestinian Christian women, with the theme "I Beg You... Bear with One Another in Love" based on Ephesians 4.1-7.

The Palestinian Christian women who wrote this worship service have invited the world to pray for peace, justice and freedom of religion and freedom of movement. Their prayers specifically call us to pray with women, refugees, persons experiencing homelessness, and all who are sick, dying and grieving. They also call us to confess to our collective role in causing the climate crisis, and to commit to repairing what we have destroyed. Finally, they call us, the global church, to be united in treating all with justice and love.

The service in the Strettons will be held at 10.30am in St Laurence Church and is open to everyone.

Keeping People Safe

The Bible speaks clearly about the church caring for those who are vulnerable and for children. As society has changed over the years, how we best protect children and vulnerable adults who are amongst us has had to change. We know that the church fell considerably behind many other organisations in doing this and, sadly, this resulted in children and vulnerable adults experiencing abuse which has a very serious and lasting impact on them.

Following national reviews and listening to survivors of this abuse, the Church of England (along with most other denominations) are implementing best practice to do all we can to avoid this happening in the future. This means we now have a standard practice of Safer Recruitment for all volunteers who are helping support children or vulnerable adults, also for those in a position of leadership. As part of that we ask people to undertake a short training course which will help them recognise and know how to respond to abuse. We also ask people to complete a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check. Both are updated every three years. The DBS check helps to ensure that people who may present a risk to vulnerable adults or children aren't invited into that area of work in churches. We understand that these changes may feel strange to some, however, we move forward in recognising that our biblical call to care for others extends to doing all we can to prevent future abuse of children and vulnerable adults.

We hope that you will join us in supporting this effort to do all we can to keep ourselves and others safe.
