Desert Detectives Holiday Club

Once again on August Bank Holiday Monday the church was transformed in preparation for Holiday Club and this year we journeyed into the Egyptian Desert, complete with pyramids and the river Nile. Our upfront team of archaeologists were getting ready for four days of digging for artefacts to help us retell the story of Moses. They were assisted by four Tent Teams who housed the new recruits for the week. – 39 enthusiastic 4 – 11 years olds (those starting Reception class in September 2025 and including those who had just completed Year 6), with 64% attending every day and several children returning for their third year.

During the week we heard how God had a plan for Moses' life as he was rescued by the Pharaoh's daughter, encountered God in a burning bush, his reliance on God through the plagues and the joy of rescuing the Israelites through the Red Sea. We were delighted to be able to share some aspects of Desert Detectives at the United Service as we discovered that God continued to provide for the Israelites for 40 years as they wandered through the desert.

We of course included all the usual elements of Holiday Club with songs, dance, challenges, jokes, crafts, games, water squirting, cream pies and lots of desserts! The children were divided into four age-grouped Tent Teams and they provided opportunities to build relationships, and to have more in-depth, age-appropriate teaching and discussion time. Everyone also had tasty, packed lunches provided every day by our kitchen team!

It was wonderful that by the end of the week the children were able to say with great enthusiasm, confidence and actions the memory verse:

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11



Pyramid Prayers




Alpha

Introducing our new Readers, Paul and Kate Green

On Sunday 7th September, Rev Mark Godson, Ministry Development Officer for the Hereford Diocese came to the morning service at St Laurence where he licensed Paul and Kate Green as Readers. We asked them to write a little bit about themselves by way of introduction.

Kate: I feel blessed to have first encountered God on a family visit to Australia. It was the time of the Charismatic renewal (then called The 'Toronto Blessing') and was pretty wild in some ways, but my experience of God's knowledge and love for me was profound and life-changing. My career has mainly been in the wine trade, including teaching wine courses, until I retrained as a relationship counsellor, which I practised for 10 years.

Paul and I have been Licensed Lay Ministers (Readers) in Essex for several years, and love serving the rural church. I am also a Spiritual Director.

I love theology, good conversations and nice food and wine with friends, walking our dog, Holly and watching good tv dramas.

Paul: Hello, I'm Paul, married to Kate with a dog called Holly. Although I have degrees in science and maths, I think creatively which enabled me to become a founding director of three technology companies. Becoming a Christian as a teenager, I came alive with the Holy Spirit in 2005.

Wanting a solid grounding for my charismatic experience I studied theology and developed an enthusiasm for the Kingdom of God, applying it in ministry and at work. In 2016, I was licensed as a Lay Minister joining a team ministry with nine rural parishes in Essex and engaging with other activities in the diocese. I am now a guide at Ironbridge Gorge Museums, dabble in model railways and have just started studying for an MA in Kingdom Theology. For me, the best thing about living in Stretton is walking in the hills with our dog and often chatting with people we meet about Jesus.

Please book in via the church website or use the QR code or call the church office.


Tickets are £8 per adult, children free (up to two per adult). A simple Harvest supper will be served (for which donations will be gratefully received on the night).


- Hand-thrown ceramic ware

OPERATIONS MANAGER

Anna Hunt is now in post as our new Operations Manager. Initially this position is for twenty-five hours a week for a fixed term for two years. We pray this may be funded from additional giving. We have a vision that, as well as one-off giving, there will be a commitment of $50 \times £30 \times 24$ i.e. fifty people committing £30/month for two years which, with Gift Aid, amounts to £40,000 (£20,000 a year) which covers salary, pension, NI etc. We are seeking Project Angels who would be willing to support with financing. Leaflets are available, explaining the plan in more detail, and we would ask that you talk about it, pray about it and speak to any member of the Ministry Team should you need further information.
